

MGA Board of Directors: Role, Qualifications, and Application Process

What is the Commitment for an MGA Board Director?

The MGA Board of Directors is a working board, requiring substantial dedication and active participation in the association's affairs. Directors are expected to:

- Devote significant time to the association's business.
- Serve on and actively participate in various committees.
- Attend all monthly board meetings.
- Be present at annual conferences and virtual roundtables.
- Engage with the membership at relevant events.

Qualifications for the Ballot

The MGA Nominating Committee seeks candidates who meet the following criteria:

- Currently work in, or are retired from, the field of guardianship/conservatorship (as professional guardians, family guardians, or allied professionals).
- Adhere to and advocate for guardianship practices that align with the National Guardianship Association's (NGA) Standards of Practice and Ethical Principles.
- Actively contribute to policy, education, practice, program development, administration, and/or research related to guardianship/conservatorship.
- Show exceptional dedication to the guardianship community or the protection of vulnerable adults through volunteering with MGA and/or other organizations.
- Contribute to a positive public perception of guardianship/conservatorship.
- Possess the necessary attributes (Insert LINK) for successful board membership.
- Be MGA members in good standing.

The Nominating Committee will review all submissions, follow up with applicants as needed, and recommend a slate of candidates for the election. This slate will then be reviewed by the MGA Executive Committee and Board of Directors before being presented to the membership for voting
